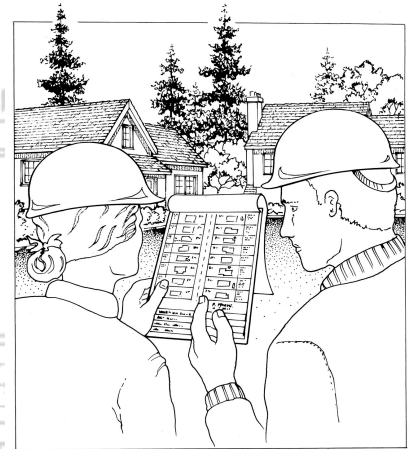


The reality is - neighborhoods may need to respond to fire, injuries, and/or crises during a disaster. This meeting will help us know how. Please come.



Meeting Reminder: “MYN”

Map Your Neighborhood

What is a disaster? Disasters, by definition, are events that overwhelm police, fire, and medical 911 emergency responders.

Why MYN? MYN helps us organize a timely response to disaster when 911 is unavailable. All of us, working together, can reduce the serious consequences of disaster in our neighborhood.

What will we do?

- We will learn a 9-step Neighborhood Response Plan that immediately helps us know what to do – both at home and in the neighborhood – to respond to injuries, and assisting people who may be alone and frightened. The process is proven, fun, and easy.

- We will “mine” our neighborhood for its valuable assets during a disaster, including the skills and equipment we jointly possess that we are willing to share.

- We will map our neighborhood’s propane tank locations so we can quickly respond to leaking gas and reduce the threat of fire.

BONUS: We will all go home with a neighborhood map, contact list, and skills and equipment inventory.
